Dobitsch Farm Update To: Farmland Preservation Board

Subject: Dobitsch Farm –

Registration in the Agricultural Security Area with Clifford Township was completed and officially recorded with the County on October 20, 2025. We are currently awaiting the establishment of a Conservation Plan with NRCS before proceeding to the next phase. The farm meets the state's minimum eligibility requirements outlined in the county guide, with a LESA score exceeding the required 50% threshold.

Once the Conservation Plan is finalized, the next step will include a site inspection and a meeting with the landowner to review the farmland preservation process in detail. This will be followed by a title search and appraisal. If all criteria are satisfied and both the title and appraisal meet state and county standards, the Preservation Board may then consider extending an offer to the landowner.

-J Barbour made a motion to order an appraisal by Don Van Fleet at a cost of \$1750, a title search by M Gathany, and to move forward in the process trying to encumber funds for this farm by 12/31/2025. Seconded by W Shay and so carried.

Subject: Dobitsch Farm –Agreement of sale

Van Fleet Appraisals was able to complete an appraisal on the Dobitsch Farm and get the report to me. They did appraise high enough to be made an Agricultural Easement offer from Susquehanna County. The title search on the deed has come back clean.

The Agricultural Preservation Board can now extend an offer to the landowners. The most that can be offered, according to our program guide, would be \$1500/an acre. The funding would be from our state balance of \$99,783.57 and would be 100% state funded. With our incidental costs, we would be over the amount that needs to be encumbered by 12/31/25.

<u>Staff Recommendation</u>: Make an offer to the landowner to bring them into the Susquehanna County Agricultural Easement Purchase Program, at \$1500 per acre. Being 100% state funded, and to move forward with the encumbering and easement process.
