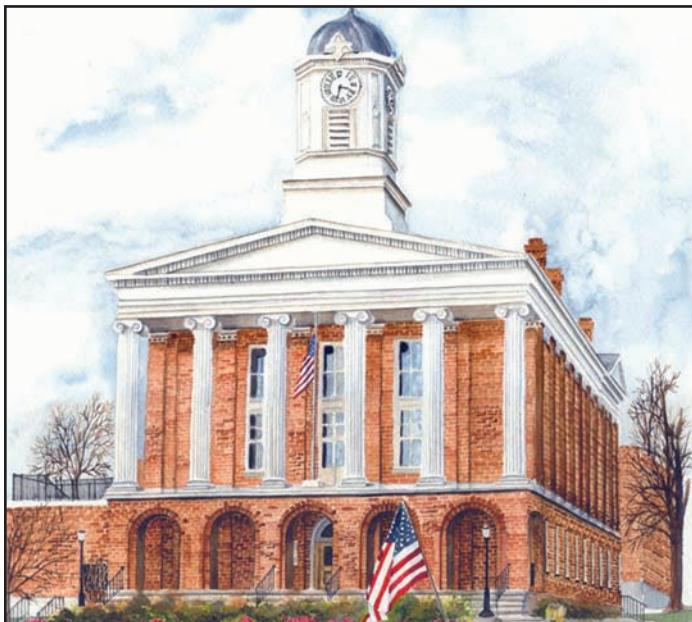

b. Inconvenient Forum

A Pennsylvania court with exclusive, continuing jurisdiction may decline to exercise that jurisdiction if it is determined that Pennsylvania is an inconvenient forum. 23 Pa. C.S. § 5427. A trial court must consider eight factors when determining if a forum is inconvenient:

- (1) whether domestic violence has occurred and what state could best protect the parties and the children;
- (2) the length of time the child has resided outside of the Commonwealth;
- (3) the distance between the court in this Commonwealth and the court that would have jurisdiction;
- (4) the relative financial circumstances of the parties;
- (5) any agreement of the parties as to which state should assume jurisdiction;
- (6) the nature and location of the evidence required to resolve the pending litigation, including child testimony;
- (7) the ability of each potential court to decide the issues in a timely manner; and
- (8) the familiarity of the court of each state with the facts and issues in the pending litigation.

23 Pa. C.S. § 5427(b); S.K.C., 294 A.3 at 414; A.D. v. M.A.B., 989 A.2d 32 (Pa. Super. Ct. 2010).

The Court will now consider each of those factors.

1. Domestic Violence

Mother contends that she relocated as a result of domestic violence. While there is some judicial evidence that the parties had a tumultuous relationship, there is nothing on this record to suggest that a Pennsylvania court would be unable to protect Mother or the children. Indeed, Mother and Father have worked out their custody agreement amicable over the past three years, including Father traveling to Iowa and seeing the children, and Mother agreeing to send the A.W. and S.W. to Pennsylvania for the summer of 2016. Thus, this factor as it relates to declining jurisdiction.

2. Length of Time Residing Outside the Commonwealth

As noted extensively herein, A.W. and S.W. have not had a substantial amount of

contact with Pennsylvania since relocating to Iowa. They have spent only 9 weeks in Pennsylvania over the past three years. To state it another way, A.W. and S.W. have spent 95% of their time in Iowa over the past three plus years. Moreover, their sister, L.W., has never returned to Pennsylvania since she relocated to Iowa. Thus, A.W. and S.W. have spent nearly the entirety of the past 3 years living outside of Pennsylvania. For these reasons, this factor weighs in favor of declining jurisdiction.

3. Distance between the potential forums

The distance between Iowa and Pennsylvania is substantial and will be present a difficulty for both parties. If the matter is heard in Iowa, it presents difficulties for Father. If the matter is heard in Pennsylvania, it presents difficulties for Mother and the children. As noted, Father has already traveled to Iowa for purposes of visitation with his children. Father currently is not employed, while Mother is employed in Iowa. It would be far easier for Father to take the time to travel to Iowa than for Mother to make arrangements with her employer to travel to Pennsylvania. If the matter were heard in Iowa, it would also minimize the amount of work that Mother would have to miss, while Father is not in a similar position. As such, this factor likewise weighs in favor of declining jurisdiction.

4. Relative financial circumstances of the parties

On the record, there is very little evidence on this record to demonstrate which party is financially better suited to litigate this matter in a foreign state. While there was testimony that Father is not employed, the record fails to demonstrate that he lacks the resources to litigate this custody matter in Iowa. As noted, Father admitted to traveling to Iowa in order to visit with his children. Mother is employed but the record failed to develop the nature of her income, the amount needed to support herself and the children and Iowa, and whether she would have the financial means to litigate this matter in Pennsylvania. Neither party testified that they would be financially unable to travel to the other location for purposes of any custody proceeding. Thus, this factor is neutral as it relates to declining jurisdiction.

5. Agreement on jurisdiction

The parties' separation agreement does not contain any forum selection clause. For this reason, this factor is neutral as it relates to declining jurisdiction.¹²

6. Nature and location of the evidence and the children.

The Children reside in Cedar Falls, Iowa. The Children's recent records – academic, medical, social – are located in Iowa. As noted, Father's modification is primarily based upon the preferences expressed by A.W. and S.W. Both of these children, along with their sister L.W., reside in Iowa. If the Court were to determine that this is an appropriate forum, then the children would be required to travel to Pennsylvania to provide their testimony.

¹² The separation agreement provides that any legal interpretations of the agreement will be interpreted under Pennsylvania law. (Sep. Agreement ¶ 17.) The present petition for modification has nothing to do with interpretation of the parties' separation agreement, and paragraph 17 is plainly not a forum selection clause. For this reason, Father's attempt to rely upon paragraph 17 as a forum selection clause is misplaced.

Father contends that the counselor that A.W. and S.W. saw this past summer is located in New York, which is obviously substantially closer to Susquehanna County, Pennsylvania than Iowa. The record, however, fails to disclose any evidentiary facts possessed by the counselor. Father has not submitted any report or other documentation as to what the counselor would offer at the time of a custody hearing. There mere fact that the children saw a counselor on several occasions over a period of 8 weeks while visiting their Father in Pennsylvania, when standing alone, does not suggest that the counselor is a necessary or essential witness in any subsequent custody proceeding.

Based upon this record, the nature and extent of the evidence relative to this custody matter is generally located in Iowa – not Pennsylvania. For this reason, this factor weighs in favor of declining jurisdiction.

7. The ability of either court to handle the matter expeditiously

There is no evidence that either the Commonwealth or Iowa would fail to handle this case in an expeditious manner. This factor is neutral as it relates to declining jurisdiction.

8. The familiarity of each court with the facts and the issues

The current custody order is a separation agreement between the two parties. This Court has never conducted a custody hearing nor made any custody determination except to approve the parties' custody agreement in June 2013. For the past 3 years, the parties have amicably worked out visitation between the children and Father without the need of court intervention. This Court has no better familiarity with this litigation than would an Iowa court. For this reason, this factor is likewise neutral as it relates to declining jurisdiction.

c. Susquehanna County is an inconvenient forum.

After weighing the relevant factors, the bulk of the factors are simply neutral between the parties, while three factors weigh in favor of declining jurisdiction. None of the factors weigh in favor of the Court retaining jurisdiction. Significantly, the children have resided in Iowa for over 3 years, and up until this past summer, the children had very little contact with Pennsylvania. Indeed, one of the parties' children has had absolutely no contact with Pennsylvania since the relocation. The other two children spent only one week in Pennsylvania over a 3 year period – prior to spending about 8 weeks in Pennsylvania for the summer of 2016. The children simply have not had substantial contacts with Pennsylvania over the past three years. While Mother agreed to allow A.W. and S.W. to come for an extended summer visit this year, this 8-week period does not alter the prior 3 years where the children had no contact (aside from a one week period) with Pennsylvania.

For the past three years, Iowa has been the children's home and Iowa is the bulk of the probative evidence is located. In particular, Father's modification request is based upon the claim that A.W. and S.W. have expressed a preference to reside with Father. These children are now in Iowa – and it is far more convenient for Father to travel to Iowa than for Mother and her three children to travel to Pennsylvania for a custody

hearing.¹³ This is especially true where all of the witnesses who are involved in the children's daily lives are located in Iowa – not Pennsylvania.

III. Conclusion

For the foregoing reasons, the Court determines that it does have exclusive, continuing jurisdiction to hear this custody matter as the record demonstrates that A.W. and S.W. have a “significant connection” with Pennsylvania as evidenced by the most recent summer vacation and the meaningful relationship that they enjoy with their Father. Under 23 Pa. C.S. § 5427(a), however, the Court finds that continuation of these custody proceedings in Pennsylvania constitutes an inconvenient forum and that the Iowa courts provide a more convenient and appropriate forum for resolutions of the pending petition for modification.



¹³ The Court is also cognizant of the need to minimize the impact upon the children to their daily routines in connection with any custody hearing. If the matter were heard in Iowa, the children would only have to miss a minimal amount of school time. If the matter remained in Pennsylvania, all three children would be required to miss an extensive amount of school time necessitated by travel time and hearing times.
